

**Articulation Proposal
For
Community Colleges of Spokane
and
Washington State University
College of Pharmacy
Doctor of Pharmacy Degree Program**

Community Colleges of Spokane (CCS) and Washington State University (WSU) share a common interest in facilitating the smooth transition of students transferring from Spokane Community College and Spokane Falls Community College to the WSU College of Pharmacy to pursue a Doctor of Pharmacy degree. The information provided here is intended to increase access to and eliminate duplication of coursework and better integrate programs to ensure a more efficient pathway to graduation. The purpose of this advising recommendation is to provide students from CCS a clear pathway to gain entrance into the Doctor of Pharmacy Program.

Students who complete the CCS approved transferable Pre-Pharmacy Associate of Science (AST) degree are eligible for admission into the Doctor of Pharmacy degree program. The focus of this agreement is to facilitate the acceptance of the pre-pharmacy specific AST degree as equivalent to the pre-requisites required for the Doctor of Pharmacy program. Since admission to the Doctor of Pharmacy program is a competitive process, all student completing the pre-pharmacy AST degree must participate in and be accepted through the Doctor of Pharmacy admissions process as outlined on the website www.pharmacy.wsu.edu.

To measure the success of this agreement both CCS and WSU College of Pharmacy agree to share aggregate and de-identified student data related to recruitment, admissions, retention and success. In addition, marketing materials and efforts to promote this agreement will include the logo's and branding of both the WSU College of Pharmacy and CCS. The College of Pharmacy will have final approval of any documents utilizing the WSU College of Pharmacy logo to assure all branding standards have been upheld




