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A significant change in EWU's procedure increases the level of faculty review of applications, so there are now earlier application deadlines. Specifically, applications to begin matriculating in the BASW Program for fall quarter may be submitted by the priority deadline of March 15th and must be submitted no later than May 10th of that same calendar year.

There are application academic eligibility requirements in place now that include:

1. Applicants must have no more than two general education core requirements (GECRs) or EWU required classes remaining (for example Culture, Gender and Diversity, International Studies, or foreign language) to be completed at the time of their application;
2. Courses that are in progress during the spring quarter in which the student is applying may be counted toward meeting the preceding criterion;
3. Applicants must have completed English 201 (ENGL& 102 at SCC) with a minimum grade of 2.7 at the time of their application;
4. Applicants must have completed Mathematics 104 (MATH 97 or 99 at SCC) with a minimum grade of 2.0 at the time of their application;
5. Students shall be advised at the time of application and admission that all GECR or EWU Graduation Requirements, except their Senior Capstone must be completed BEFORE a student may begin their practicum placement during the second year of the program.

Applicants who do not meet these basic eligibility criteria at the time of their application shall not be admitted to the BASW Program nor will their application be sent to any faculty member for review or consideration.

There are professional readiness criteria in place now that include:

1. Students must have spent a minimum of 40 hours in a volunteer or paraprofessional capacity working in one agency or organization where the applicant's primary responsibilities were directly connected to enhancing clients' development, meeting clients' basic needs, assisting clients in problem solving or advocating for the needs of vulnerable or oppressed people;
2. Students must include verification, through a signed standard form (provided in the application materials), from the person who had direct supervisory responsibility over them and their volunteer or paraprofessional work;
3. Students must provide two professional or academic references and one MUST be from volunteer or Human Services work experience supervisor.

Students who do not meet these criteria or provide appropriate references at the time of their application shall not receive further consideration for admission during the cycle in which they apply.

Because all of our practicum agencies require a background check before they will accept any student for a placement, applicants must demonstrate honesty in writing about any adult record they may have with Criminal Justice, Child Protective Services (CPS) or Adult Protective Services (APS) as a supplement to their application. Although having a criminal justice or protective services incident in their background does not preclude admission to the program, we believe it is necessary to have an early and candid conversation with applicants about how their background might impact their ability to participate in required practicum learning and subsequent professional employment. Failure to disclose all of the circumstances of any adult record with Criminal Justice, CPS or Adult Protective Services at the time of application to the BASW Program is grounds for immediate dismissal from the program when said information is discovered.

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
