Program Description

Basic Cabinetry

This program offers a one-quarter certificate in basic cabinetry. Students are introduced to fundamental terminology and basic math needed in the design, layout, and construction of residential cabinetry. Other topics covered Basic Cabinetry are interior cabinet finishes, including stain application and spraying water-based lacquers using a HVLP system. Emphasis is placed on the safe and proper use of both stationary and portable power equipment.

Students may enter the program winter quarter only. Enrollment is limited to space available; preference is given to those students working towards their A.A.S. degree or one-year certificates.

Advanced Cabinetry

This cabinetry program is designed for students who wish to obtain advanced skills in cabinetry. The coursework provides both basic and advanced projects that require additional skills and techniques not offered in the basic program. Permission of the instructor is required for admission to the program.

Career Opportunities

A career in cabinetry is suited to the person who has an interest in and aptitude for working with portable and stationary power equipment and a large array of materials including hardwoods, man-made composite boards, cabinet hardware and finishes. Employment can cover everything from laying out and designing kitchens to the cutting, assembly and application of the various finishes in today's market. Others may choose to install the finished product. Wages in the local area range from \$9.00 to \$15.00 an hour. Potential for higher pay increases with advanced experience and knowledge.

POTENTIAL POSITIONS INCLUDE: kitchen designer, material estimator, cabinet maker, cabinet maker's assistant, modular cabinet worker including cutting components, sanding, assembly and finish work, cabinet installer's assistant, custom furniture design and construction.
