- Interviews will take place **May 22-26**, **2007**. You will be notified of your interview time, date, and location via e-mail.
- Final decisions will be made and announced on or around June 1, 2007.
- Twenty-five students will be selected to enroll in the first class of the CFE. Up to ten students will be placed on a waiting list and will be notified if space becomes available prior to the beginning of fall guarter '07.
