

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

AAS DEGREE IN PARALEGAL PROGRAM SPOKANE COMMUNITY COLLEGE to

BACHELOR OF ARTS IN BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION, GENERAL MANAGEMENT EASTERN WASHINGTON UNIVERSITY

Purpose:

The purpose of this agreement is to establish an agreement for seamless transition of specific programs between Eastern Washington University and Spokane Community College. Students who complete the combined program as outlined in this agreement earning an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree in the **Paralegal Program** at Spokane Community College will be able to complete a Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration at Eastern Washington University by following the program as outlined. This agreement is intended to eliminate duplication of courses, provide a framework for degree completion and is consistent with the goals and objectives of both institutions.

Assumptions:

- Students must meet criteria for Admission to Eastern Washington University and for admission to the Business Program.
- Students must complete 90-quarter credit hours at EWU.
- Students must complete all required business administration and supporting courses for the BA in Business Administration with a minimum of 2.0. The student must have an upper division business administration core and major grade point average of 2.5 to graduate.
- The student will receive a credit award of 33 credits in addition to courses already qualifying as college transfer credit upon admission to Eastern Washington University if he/she has completed the requirements for the AAS in the Paralegal Program at SCC as outlined in the attached curriculum.

General Education Core Requirements and University Graduation Requirements

- The student will be responsible for taking any pre-university basic skills necessary for successful completion of required courses. These courses do not count toward the 180 credits required for graduation.
- The student must complete University competencies including CPLA 101 (or by exam) and ENGL 101 (or by testing into and completing ENGL 201).
- The student must complete ENGL 201 and MATH 200 or MATH 115 or their equivalents.
- The student will complete eight general education core courses. These courses may be taken at EWU or their equivalents, as specified in the SCC/EWU transfer guide, may be taken at SCC as outlined in Suggested Curriculum.
- The student must also complete University Graduation Requirements including Cultural and Gender Diversity, International Studies and LAEC 310 as well as the Business Administration Senior Capstone which also serves as the University senior capstone. Only one course with a prefix designator from the primary major department can be taken for General Education Core Requirements, Cultural and Gender Diversity or International Studies.

This agreement will be reviewed for accuracy and program changes January 1, 2001 or before that date if program changes are instituted at either Eastern Washington University or Spokane Community College.
