



**ART – Articulated Program (Associate of Fine Arts Degree)\***  
**Spokane Falls Community College and Eastern Washington University**

Average Length of Program: 97 Credits, 6 Quarters

Completion Award: A.F.A. Degree

**Program Description**

Spokane Falls Community College and Eastern Washington University have created a seamless transition of courses for the student pursuing a Bachelor of Fine Arts (B.F.A.) degree.

This articulation agreement allows SFCC students who have attained a two-year Associate of Fine Arts (A.F.A.) in visual arts to transfer into the EWU Bachelor of Fine Arts (B.F.A.), a five-year program. The advantage for SFCC students in this program is it will only require two years of study at EWU for SFCC graduates to complete the 115 credits (largely upper-division) of the B.F.A. program. They can earn a B.F.A. in four years after the time they start at SFCC. This is possible because of the comprehensive fine arts curriculum offered at SFCC.

A.F.A. graduates from SFCC enter EWU as candidates for a Bachelor of Arts and then submit their portfolios for admission to the Bachelor of Fine Arts program. The B.F.A. is taken in the last three quarters of attendance at EWU.

**Program Goals**

1. Complete a two-year fine arts foundation in preparation for transfer to EWU for a Bachelor of Fine Arts (B.F.A.).
2. Develop a portfolio for transfer to EWU, which will highlight the best work completed at SFCC, emphasizing originality, facility, and exploration.

**A.F.A. Degree:** Faculty coaching of studio and academic work is essential for this degree. At least 30 credits in art must be earned at Spokane Falls Community College, including the final quarter of the program. A cumulative grade point of 2.0 or better must be maintained. Students should meet with their art adviser to review the EWU transfer program before selecting courses.
